BANK OF MONTREAL LIMITS CALGARY TO \$1,500,000

While City Financiers Assert That \$2,800,000 is Sum Most Necessary

Although the estimates made up by the finance committee some time ago for work necessary this year, totalling \$3,570,000, the Bank of Montreal is still standing pat refusing to advance the city more than \$1,500,000 at this time until some of the Calgary securities are disposed of on the London market. Some of the city officials are inclined to believe that the bank is simply figuring on driving a rather hard bargain with the city, now that the municipality appears to be backed into a hole.

In any event, the bank has asked for an exact statement of the sums that the city requires, and Mayor Mitchell instructed City Comptroller Woods to prepare such a statement. The comptroller took the original estimate of \$3,570,000 and is visiting all departments, paring this down to the bone. It is doubted, however, if the estimate can be chopped down below \$3,000,000 or \$2,800,000 at the least. Much of the work has already been started under contracts let in anticipation of the sale of the bonds.

It is possible that some arrangement may be attempted whereby the contractors will try to finance their own work on the strength of estimates of their jobs furnished them by the city on which they may borrow money from the local banks. The only question is whether the banks may not charge the contractors more interest than the local improvement bonds ordinarily will draw.

THE PLANS FOR FUNERAL OF MUTSUHITO PERFECTED

Services Will Commence at Six On the Evening of September 13; Last Two Days

Ceremonies Will be Held at Tokio and Beside Tomb of Kioto; Full Shinto Ritual

Tokio, Aug. 15.—The official program for the funeral of Mutsuhito, who died on July 30, was issued today. The services are to begin at 9 o'clock a.m. September 13, when Emperor Yoshihito and the empress dowager will be present.

At 7 o'clock p.m. the elder statesmen, the peers, all the high officials and the foreign representatives are to assemble at the palace, from which the procession will start at 8 p.m. Emperor Yoshihito will not join the procession, but will meet it on the Aoyama parade ground.
