How much does the average Lon ner waste in a day? This is a question that cannot be easily answered, but certain it is that the aggregate waste of the whole city totals a sum that would mean much toward a govermment war loan or some similar patriotic object.

That much of this waste could be prevented is a fact, but the prevention could only be done by individual effort.

A visit to the city incinerator reveals he fact that little can be done there oward preventing wastage. It is stated at the necessary increase in the nur of employees would be so costl as to make the scheme probi Thrown-Away Foodstuffs.

Twenty-six carts are used in London transport garbage and refuse from e homes of citizens to the incinera where it is used for heating pur poses. Nearly every load brings quantities of foodstuffs, which, for the wasteful tendencies of Cana-dian housekeepers, might be used instead of being destroyed. At times it is possible to save as much as two or three barrels of bread, suitable for chicken feed, which has been allowed to become stale or unsuitable for table use. This is only a small portion of that which might be saved, it is stated, if individuals were more careful as to the foodstuffs discarded or if careful buying were exercised Articles which can be saved at the inclnerator are, by the time they reach there, only suitable as chicken feed.
