In the week before Christmas ten large turkeys and fifteen geese were received to be destroyed, and on Wednesday 65 chickens were brought in by the collectors. These all come from one cold storage plant, according to the collectors. They state that they have never received such large numbers of dead fowl from other similar plants in the city.
