RACING AT MONTREAL.

The summer meeting of the Montreal Club commenced at the Fashion Course, Blue Bonnets, on Saturday, 20th inst. The Stewards were Messrs. Andrew MacDougall, J. D. Crawford, J. O'Brien, Jas. P. Dawes, H. S. MacDougall, Jas. McShane, M.P.P., and Dr. J. J. The management of the meeting was entrusted to Mr. Wm. Carson, and from a very smooth manner in which everything was carried off, it was easy to see that the right of a man was at the helm. The weather was intensely warm, but the attendance was large, notwithstanding. The event of the day was, of course, the race for the Queen's Plate, of the Province of Quebec. It had six entries, of which Speculator was the favorite in the pools, with Speculum for second choice. On being called up to get the word they faced the starter. It was a magnificent race between the Speculum colts. At the quarter pole they pulled away from the rest, and running past the stand at the finish the first mile a sheet would have covered the two. Rounding the last turn the Lancer colt showed he was distressed, but he merely responded to the steel, though he was unable to overhaul the horse from Bourgois, who won by a length. The winner is a fine-looking bay horse by Speculum (English) out of Castaway, and although not bred in England, was foaled on the farm of the late John Shedden, Esq., near Montreal. Speculator was also bred in the same way, his dam Sweetbread being imported likewise by Mr. Shedden. The following is a summary of the race:—

The veteran was the first away at spanking pace, and held the lead for about a mile and a half, when Grey Cloud went like a son of thunder, followed by Castaway, and overhauling the "old feller" made him take third position. A protest was entered against Grey Cloud for having gone on a wrong side of the flag, but it was disallowed by the stewards.
