pliances, formerly of Montreal, but now of
St. Croix, N.B., has assigned on demand.

The Intercolonial Ry. Employees Relief and
Insurance Association, at its annual meeting
at Moncton, Oct. 12, elected the following
officers:—President, D. Pottinger, Gen-
eral Manager; Vice-President, J. J. Wallace,
General Freight Agent; Auditor, W. Brown,
chief clerk. It was decided to ask the Depart-
ment of Railways to increase its contribution
on the ground of the increased membership
caused by the taking over of the Canada East-
ern Ry.

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The St. Thomas Car Wheel Co. (Ltd.), in
winding up its business, has assigned to
E. R. C. Clarkson, accountant, Toronto, all
the moneys received or receivable from the
Canadian Iron and Foundry Co. as considera-
tion for the lease of the premises occupied in
St. Thomas, Ont., for distribution among its
creditors; and a further assignment was made
to trustees of all its interest in buildings,
machinery, and all property of every kind
for the benefit of creditors. The amount of
the claims filed and proved is \$109,576.71,
and the cash in the hands of the trustees is
\$37,581.48. The estate has been realized,
and the debts proven, so that only formal
matters have to be complied with prior to the
distribution of the assets, Nov. 14.
