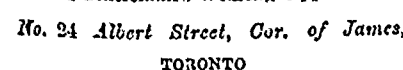

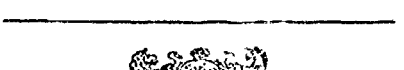

HOME MISSION COMMITTEE CANADA PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

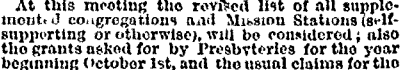
The half yearly meeting of the Home Mission Committee will be held in Knox College, On Tuesday, October 6th, 1874, at 9 a.m.

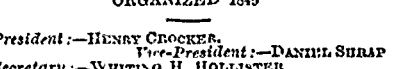
