

Aboriginals

- From the beginning, First Nations, Métis, and urban Aboriginal groups have been involved in the decision making for Canada's bid for the 2010 Winter Games. They are working with the Canadian government and other partners to create meaningful economic, social, sports, and cultural opportunities for their communities as a result of the Games.

People with disabilities

- People with disabilities would be involved in the Winter Games at all levels — as building consultants, organizers, athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, and fans. The Games would create the exposure and facilities necessary for Canada to increase participation in sports for disabled people.

Volunteerism

- Vancouver 2010 would train the more than 20,000 volunteers required for the Winter Games, creating a skilled volunteer workforce to strengthen communities across British Columbia and Canada.
