TRADE

CUBA-INQUIRY AS TO GOVERNMENT POLICY

On the orders of the day:

Mr. P. V. Noble (Grey North): I should like to address a question to the Minister of Trade and Commerce. Is it the policy of this government to promote increased trade with Cuba, similar to the approach made by the former Conservative administration?

Hon. Mitchell Sharp (Minister of Trade and Commerce): In view of the fact that I have not had notice of this question I think I should perhaps answer it tomorrow.

Mr. Noble: A supplementary question-

Mr. Speaker: Order. I think we should leave it there. The minister said he would take this as notice and answer the question tomorrow.

Mr. Noble: Mr. Speaker, I should like to direct this question to the Minister of Trade and Commerce. Now that fish rationing has ended in Cuba, will the government make an effort to sell more fish products to that country?

Mr. Sharp: Mr. Speaker, as I said in reply to an earlier question, I think I should deal with these questions of trade relations with Cuba all at once, and I will bear this question in mind when I am making my answer tomorrow.

MUNICIPAL LOAN FUND—RESOLUTION OF QUEBEC LEGISLATURE

On the orders of the day:

Hon. Leon Balcer (Three Rivers): Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct a question to the Prime Minister.

Could the Prime Minister tell us whether he has received the resolution unanimously carried by the Quebec legislature condemning the bill of federal assistance to municipalities, as well as an explanatory letter from Premier Lesage?

Right Hon. L. B. Pearson (Prime Minister): To the best of my knowledge no such resolution has been received, but I will inquire when I go back to my office.
