1. What was the cost of a round-trip from Winnipeg with stops in Regina, Calgary, Vancouver, Edmonton, Saskatoon in April 1970 and April 1971?

2. What was the percentage increase in the cost of this fare?

Mr. Gérard Duquet (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): The Canadian Transport Commission advises as follows: 1. April 1970 first class \$186, economy class \$138; April 1971 first class \$285, economy class \$211.

2. First class 53.2 per cent, economy class 52.9 per cent.

COST OF FAMILY FARE VANCOUVER TO MONTREAL WITH
STOP-OVERS IN WINNIPEG AND TORONTO

Question No. 1,419—Mr. Orlikow:

1. What was the cost of a family fare (husband, wife, one child over 12, one child under 12) Vancouver to Montreal with stop-overs in Winnipeg and Toronto in April 1970 and April 1971?

2. What was the percentage increase in the cost of this fare?

Mr. Gérard Duquet (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): The Canadian Transport Commission advises as follows: 1. April 1970 first class \$459.85, economy class \$341.05; April 1971 first class \$691.30, economy class \$510.45.

2. Percentage increases first class 50.3 per cent, economy class 49.7 per cent.
