from fome westerly part of Lake Erie, to a river running without any falls, thro' feveral Indian towns into Lake St. Clair.

I think Toronto a most convenient place for a factory, and that from thence we may very eafily fettle the north-fide of Lake Erie.

We left Toronto the 1ft of October, fteering fouth, right acrofs the weft-end of Lake Ontario. At dark we arrived at the fouth-fhore, five miles weft of Fort Niagara, fome of our boats being now become exceeding leaky and dangerous.

This morning, before we fet out, I directed the following order of march:

"The boats in a line. If the wind role high, the red flag holfted, and the boats to crowd nearer, that they might be ready to give mutual affiftance in cafe of a leak or other accident;" by which means we faved the crew and arms of the boat commanded by Lieut. M'Cormack, which fprung a leak and funk, lofing nothing except their packs.

We halted all the next day at Niagara, and provided ourfelves with blankets, coats, fhirts, fhoes, magaffins, &c.

I received from the commanding officer eighty barrels of provisions, and changed two whale-
