MINUTES of the proceedings of a Public Meeting held in the City Hall on Wednesday the 15th Nov. 1837. pursuant to a notice issued by His Worship the Mayor, to take into consideration the most efficient means of relieving the Poor and Destitute of this City, and the promotion of the interests of the House of Refuge and Industry established therein.

HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR in the Chair

The Chairman commenced the meeting by a few introductory remarks, which he closed by calling on the Secretary to lead the Report.

The Secretary having read the Report, it was

Moved by the Hon. W. H. Draper, seconded by the Rev. E. Evans,

That the Report just read be adopted Moved by the Rev. W. M. Harvard seconded by the Hon. Wm. Allan.

That it is the duty and privilege of Christians to provide for the wants of the Poor, and that as a means of so doing, so far as this City is concerned, it is important every exertlon should be made to render the House of Industry a permanent institution.

Moved by Sheriff Jarvis, seconded by the Rev. W. M. Harvard,

That in order to render any public charity efficient, it is absolutely necessary street-begging be discontinued, and that by the steady co-operation alone of the inhabitants of this City and District, can the contemplated relief to the poor be impartially and effectually distributed.

Moved by Alderman John Powell, seconded by J. W. Brent Esq.

That inasmuch as this City is the general resort of the Poor, and has to relieve the destitute from every part of the District, it is expedient that an application be made both to the Provincial Parliament and the Home District generally, for aid in support of this charity.

Moved by Dr. Baldwin, seconded by the Rev. Mr. McDonough,

That it is the opinion of this meeting n application might with propriety be made by the inhabitants of this City to the Corporation for the appropriation of a sum of money in aid of the funds of the House of Industry, and that such application be made forthwith.

Moved by the Rev. James Harris, seconded by the Rev. Alex. Stewart,

That the following do compose the Committee for the Relief of the Poor and Destitute, and for the House of Industry for the ensuing year:
