The soundness of the views advocated by General Hewson, in that part of his case from the Pacific to Norway House, is fully borne out by the report on the Peace River District, from the Chief Engineer, Mr. Sandford Fleming, just laid before Parliament; and we have but little doubt that when the remaining portion of the route from Norway House to Quebec has been explored, it will be found to be equally feasible and advantageous, and will lead to the final adoption of this route as the truly Imperial and National location.
