

MILITARY TATTOO INSPIRING EVENT

Ten Toronto Bands Take Part
in Riverdale Program
Tonight.

TO BOOST RECRUITING

Natural Amphitheatre Will
Accommodate Big Crowds
—Sergeants Will Be Busy.

Tonight's military tattoo in Riverdale park promises to be the greatest event of its kind ever held in Toronto. Ten military bands will participate. Eight of these are brass, one is a bugle band and the other a pipe band. It will be a spectacle long to be remembered and the effect which it will have upon recruiting in Toronto should be far-reaching.

Musical and patriotic Toronto, it is expected, will turn out a mass and there will be abundant room at the large natural amphitheatre which Riverdale park affords. It is not thought that yesterday's showers will interfere to any great extent and provided good weather prevails today the grounds should be in good condition. Postponement from last Wednesday evening was necessitated thru last Tuesday's heavy storm.

Assemble Near Bridge.
At 7.30 the bands will assemble near the bridge on the east side of the river. At 8 the Q.O.R. Bugle Band will sound "first post". The spectacle will have assumed a most inspiring character. "O Canada," "Rule Britannia," "Soldiers of the King," "Tipperary," "The Maple Leaf" are only a few of the stirring tunes to be rendered. A combined march in which both bugles and bands will take part will be one of the features of the evening.

A fitting conclusion will be given in the rendition of the "Doxology" followed by "God Save the King." In connection with the band concert there will be a display of fireworks. All bands are requested to report to Lieut. Waldron, bandmaster of the Royal Grenadiers, at the east side of the park, where all instructions will be given.

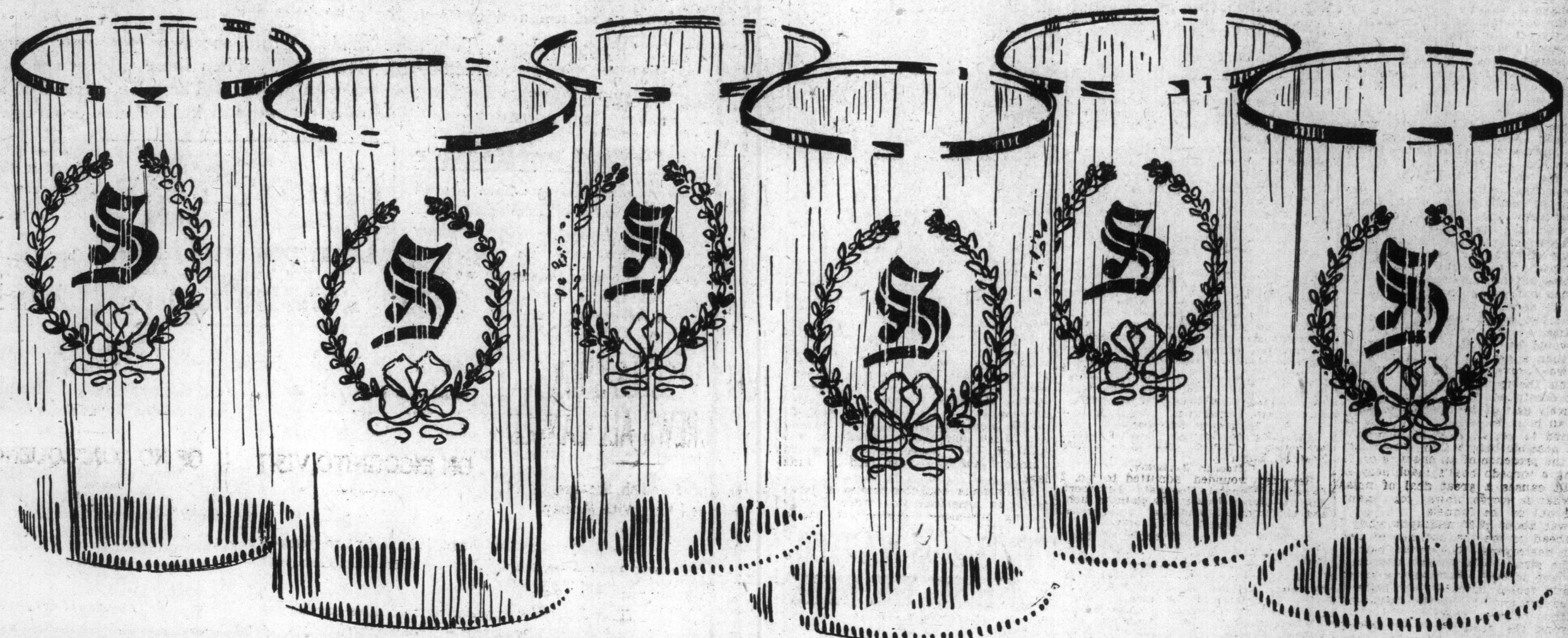
