DESCRIPTION.

LENGTH eleven inches. Bill dusky black, an inch and a half in length: crown of the head blue green: throat, breast, neck, and back, reddish brown: sides of the head and throat darkest, streaked with white: rump and tail, and the under parts from the breast, fine ultramarine blue: the middle tail feathers are green; the outer ones blue at the bottoms and tips, and sea-green in the middle: the wings are green and blue.

PLACE.

Inhabits *Ceylon*.

DESCRIPTION.

WE have no knowledge of this, but from *Linnaeus*, whose description is very short indeed. He merely says, that the bird is blue, with the outer edge of the quills luteous; and that the female is of a blueish black.

Inhabits *Æthiopia*.

DESCRIPTION.

LENGTH eight inches. Bill dusky: the upper parts of the plumage of a pale glossy blue green, except the tips of the wings, which are black: the under parts of the body ferruginous.
