HOLD MEMORIAL SERVICE AT MASSEY HALL TO-MORROW

Sir John Gibson, Sir James Whitney and Many Other Prominent Citizens Will Speak—Dr. Ham Will Play Dead March in Saul.

A memorial service will be held in Massey Hall at 4 o'clock to-morrow afternoon, under the auspices of the British and Foreign Sailors' Society, for those who met death when the ill-fated steamer Titanic sank in the Atlantic Ocean last Monday morning.

Many members from the city yacht clubs will attend the service and it is expected that the citizens will turn out also.

Prominent Speakers.
Prominent men in various walks of public life have announced their intention of taking part in the services, including: Sir John Gibson, Sir James Whitney, Hon. Dr. Pyne, Hon. W. J. Hanna, Mayor Geary, N. W. Rowell, K.C., G. T. Somers, R. S. Gourlay, Aemilius Jarvis and Dr. Conboy.
