Senate Compelled to Promulgate the Obnoxious Decree, on a Threat That Russian Soldiers Would Be Sent Into the Grand Duchy - Finnish Diet Stops Debates and Ladies at the Capital Go Into Mourning. Stockholm, Feb. 24.-The new Russlan Governor-General of Finland has at length forced the Finnish Senate to promulgate the decree of Emperor Nicholas, recently issued, depriving the Finnish Parliament of the exclusive right heretofore enjoyed of discussing measures designed to bring Finland into closer conformity with the rest of the Empire. He had threatened, in the event of a refusal, to proclaim a state of slege, and to introduce a force of Russian troops into the Grand Duchy. A despatch to The Aftonbladt from Heisingfors, capital of Finland, says that in onsequence of the Czar's refusal to see a deputation on the subject of the decree, the Finnish Diet has stopped the debates. General consternation prevails, and the Finnish ladies are wearing mourning.
