Mr. Ross is engaged in ridding the province of this abuse Sir Wilfrid Laurier should introduce a much-needed finsolvency law, which would at the same time grant a new lease of life to thousands of men who have been unfortunate in business and speculation, and extend the credit of the country abroad, and thereby facilitate business intercourse between Canada and foreign countries.


