HIS THREE CHILDREN DIED.

Rev. A. R. Saunders, a Missionary

From Toronto, in China,

Sadly Bereaved.

BOXERS CAUSED THEIR DEATH

One Missionary Murdered and Two

Others Died From Injuries

While Fighting From Shanghai.

Sad news came by cable to the China

land Mission, 907 Church-st., Toronto,

yesterday, that three children of Rev. A. R. Saunders, a missionary, who went to China

from Toronto, died from injuries received at the hands of the boxers while on the way

from Shanghai to the Province of Shan

Hankow. Rev. Mr. Saunders and his wife

arrived safely at Hankow with other mis-

sionaries, who fled from the disturbed dis-

trict. One missionary was murdered and

two others died on the journey.

These Missionaries Safe.

The cable tells of the safe arrival of

Mr. E. J. Cooper, from station of Lu-

ching, Rev. A. R. and Mrs. Glover, from

station of Lu-chow, Rev. A. R. and Mrs. Sam-

uelson, from Shanghai. Also six children, ev-

erly the children of Mr. E. J. Cooper and

from Luchow, murdered; Miss M. E. Hus-

ton, from Luchow; Mrs. J. Cooper, from

Luchow, and the three Saunders children
