How to Become Your Own Landlord.

There are few matters that are engaging more attention just at present than the question of becoming your own landlord. There is undoubtedly a big demand for houses, rents are higher, consequently the value of property is fully expected to increase very considerably in a short time. Therefore one would naturally be struck with the idea that now is the best time to buy a home and escape being obliged to bow to the landlords' demands. To accomplish this end inducements are being held out by a large number of Toronto's real estate men and most of the local loan companies whereby a person possessing one or two hundred dollars and wishing to purchase a house of his own can do so by leaving down a deposit of say one hundred dollars and paying the remainder of the amount in monthly, quarterly, half-yearly or yearly instalments, when considered, are in some cases very little more than the figure that would be paid for feal, and then the fruitful result is, that by following up the payments the house becomes your property. Truly, under the circumstances just indicated, there is practically no obstacle to prevent every working citizen being his own landlord and thus be in a position to shield off, in a successful manner, the dreaded troubles of the present day tenant of a house in Toronto.


