First Blood for Liberals

Two Seats Carried by the Government by Acclamation.

The Whitney Candidates Opposed in Every Constituency.

A Clean Sweep for the Liberals in Western Ontario.

Two Opposition Candidates to One Government Nominee in Each of the Lambtons.

A Returning Officer Blocked by a Snowstorm.

Four Candidates in London and Four in Oxford.

Withdrawal of Conservative and Independent Nominees.

The omens of victory for the Government of Ontario on Tuesday next were added to at the nominations yesterday. Two straight supporters of the Liberal party were returned by acclamation. Not a Conservative candidate in the whole 94 finds himself in a similarly enviable position. In Prescott, Mr. Ewart (Liberal) had no opposition. Then, in South Bruce, where a determined attempt was made by Mr. Whitney to get opposition to Mr. Trux, the popular Liberal candidate has been returned by acclamation. It being impossible for the Opposition to coax even a Patron candidate to court defeat.

In Parry Sound, the Conservatives have put up a candidate in opposition to Mr. W. R. Beatty, who gave the Government an independent support at last election, and has promised to do so in the next Legislature. Mr. Beatty's election is, however, certain. In Monck, Mr. Beck, the independent candidate, has retired, leaving a straight contest between Mr. Harcourt, the provincial treasurer, and Mr. Galbraith. In Centre Bruce, Mr. Shoulcliffe, the Conservative candidate, has retired, leaving the field to Mr. Malcolm, Liberal, and Mr. MacDonald, independent. In North Essex a third candidate, Mr. Joseph Martin, has appeared in the field. North Oxford, like this city, has four candidates, but the result in either case will be the same—the government supporter will triumph. In East Middlesex, Mr. Shore, the patron member, in last legislature, which is decidedly in favor of Dr. McWilliam, the government candidate. For East Lambton and for West Lambton, the Conservative organizer for Western Ontario (Dr. Roome), Mr. Beattie, M.P. for London, and Mr. Marter, Mr. Whitney's lieutenant, made a special arrangement at a secret convocation in this city two weeks ago. The agreement was that the Conservative candidate should be withdrawn in East Lambton, and that the Conservatives should support the P. P. A. nominee, Mr. McCallum. It was also arranged that no Conservative candidate should be nominated in West Lambton, and that Mr. Gurd, the P. P. A. nominee in that riding, should have the support of the Conservative party. This official programme, however, a number of Conservatives in both the Lambtons have repudiated, and one of their number has entered the field in each of these ridings. This development was not required to insure the success of the government candidates, as Messrs. Pettey and Pardee were winners anyway. But the development will only add to their clench on victory. Hardy has thus gained two seats by acclamation, while the opposition is opposed in every constituency either by government candidates or by Patrons, who will doubtless give the Liberals an independent support.

Mr. Whitney some time ago denounced the Patrons in no unmeasured terms, so that they cannot be expected to have any confidence in him. The snowstorm was so great in this

A Yukon Railway Offer Which Was Never Made.

Interesting Correspondence Between the Prime Minister and Sir William Van Horne.

Ottawa, Feb. 22.—The opposition have been prophesying that the Hamilton Smith offer to build the Yukon railway, during the past few days, would produce a rapid change of public opinion. The papers brought down yesterday by Sir William Laurier produced a sensation. Sir William Laurier is a romantic of talent, and in the course of serious negotiations in regard to the Yukon railway, made the assertion that he had offered, through Sir William Van Horne, to build a railway over the Dalton Trail for a reasonable subsidy, or over the Stikine route, if the government preferred that route. In order to settle this point most effectively, Sir William Laurier wrote to Sir William Van Horne as follows:

"Dear Sir William Van Horne,—On the 15th inst. I received from Mr. Hamilton Smith a letter, as to the statements of which I would desire to communicate with you. Mr. Smith in his letter makes the following assertion: 'My associates and myself have been connected with the Treadwell mine and other gold mines on the coast of Alaska, so that we have been especially familiar with the northern country. Last year at our instance Mr. Henry Brantley was sent on an exploring expedition from Lynn Canal to Dawson, with instructions to see what route was best adapted for the construction of a railway from the coast to the unobstructed waters of the Yukon. He returned via the so-called Dalton Trail from Rink Rapids by Hootchell and Dalton Post to Pyramid Harbor, noting elevation, distances, and the character of the country. He was, we are informed, the second of the route which has passed over the entire length of this line. His report to us was so favorable as to the many advantages of this route that as soon as your minister of the interior returned from the west I approached, through a mutual friend, offering to build the line in 1898, substantial rights, with no cash subsidy, but with a reasonable land grant covering mineral rights. 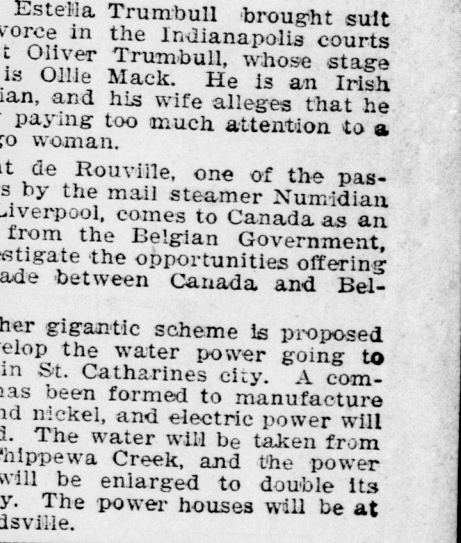
The defense in the trial of Sheriff Martin and his deputies at Tiffin, Ohio, is trying to prove that the people were afraid of the strikers, and that they fired first.

It is said that there has been a revival of the intervention upon the exportation of tobacco from Cuba, and as a result there is a scarcity of both flint and leaf tobacco.

Mrs. Estelle Trumbull brought suit for divorce in the Indianapolis courts against Oliver Trumbull, whose stage name is Ollie Mack. He is an Irish Canadian, and his wife, who is now paying too much attention to a Chicago woman.

Count de Rouville, one of the passengers by the steamer Numidian from Liverpool, comes to Canada as an agent from the Belgian Government, to investigate the opportunities offering for trade between Canada and Belgium.

Another gigantic scheme is proposed to develop the water power going to waste in St. Catharines city. A company has been formed to manufacture steel and nickel, and electric power will be used. The water will be taken from the Chippewa Creek, and the power canal will be enlarged to double its capacity. The power houses will be at Reynoldsville.
