

The following statement has been received from the office of the minister of education, together with a circular urging school inspectors and principals to encourage thrift among the pupils:
There is no conflict of interest between the promoters of thrift stamps and the men who are behind the penny bank. Both institutions aim at the development of thrift among Canadian people and both are operated without profit to the promoters. All the money spent in buying thrift stamps and all the money deposited in the penny bank is always at the disposal of the Dominion Government. There is a complete understanding between the men who inaugurated the sale of the thrift stamps and those who are responsible.
