Tree signed two contracts, but was ordered to report to London by President Jackson at the meeting of the Michigan-Ontario Baseball League held Sunday last.

Detroit Cuban Stars will play a three-day series beginning this afternoon.

The games will be called at 4 o'clock (new time). The Stars put up a first-class exhibition of baseball on Tuesday afternoon with the locals, and the London baseball fans will have other opportunities to see the Stars on the field again.

Manager Keenan will likely use Gilbert in the box this afternoon against the Detroiters. Tree will catch behind the plate.

Alex. Hill, the player Keenan received from the Toronto Leafs, went into the box yesterday and pitched a few innings of good ball. Hill is an outfielder, but London leaders may make a real hurler out of him.
