There is no firm in Canada except the Dunlop Company making bicycle tires of the inextensible edge pattern; but some foreign makers are presuming on the ignorance of the Canadian retailer by shipping wheels fitted with tires which infringe the Canadian Dunlop patent. Of course the foreign maker is out of the reach of the Canadian patent office and cannot be prose-Once he has sold his goods in Canada, and been paid for them, he has nothing to fear. The trouble then falls entirely upon the retailer and the stock he has bought is liable to the foreign manufacturer.

There are a number of retailers who stand to lose heavily through having imported bicycle tires having inextensible side wires, without regard for the Canadian patent, and the Dunlop Tire and Rubber Goods Company is sending out notices to all the trade in Canada warning dealers to respect patent rights, or accept the conse-
