1909. Many notable events in all departments of human activity marked the year that closed yesterday. Opening under the influence of the wave of depression that swept over the financial, commercial and industrial worlds, the leading countries were confronted by large deficits, necessitating considerable readjustments of taxation. The nations specially affected were the United Kingdom and the German Empire, their monetary troubles being complicated and heightened thru the endeavor of Germany to raise its navy to a point threatening British maritime predominance, and the special efforts made by Britain to maintain its previous and long continued superiority. Public opinion in the United Kingdom was raised to a high pitch of excitement by the admissions made by Liberal ministers and the inflammatory appeals of the opposition spokesmen and always more or less imminent. and newspapers, and culminated in a war scare which soon attained unprecedented proportions. 
