Canterbury Pilgrims at "The Tabard," 14th Century. The Tabard Inn, in Southwark, was the starting place for the yearly pilgrimages to the shrine of Thomas a Becket at Canterbury. All sorts and conditions of men journeyed in company—presumably for protection—but there is a strong suspicion that pilgrims made the proceedings rather more jocular than devout. Chaucer's personally conducted party included, besides himself, a knight and his squire, a reeve, a lawyer, a sailor, a prioress, two nuns, a deter, a pardoner, a monk, a friar, a summoner, a clerk of "Oxenford." a merchant, a franklin, a canon, and a lady from Bath—truly a mixed company.
