SPRINGFIELD, Mass., March 30 .-The Springfield Union today will say that Jack Delaney, rated the uncrowned light - heavyweight champion, now spending a few days with his parents in Holyoke, near here, is eager to box Jack Dempsey on any terms for the world's heavyweight title.

"I really believe I would have an excellent chance against Dempsey," the French-Canadian boxer is quoted as saying. "I know I can outbox the champion and I am confident I can hit as hard as he can. He would have a weight advantage of about twenty pounds on me, but I expect to build up to about 183 pounds within a year and at that weight could box on practically even terms."


