

# WHAT'S DOING IN THE MONEY AND STOCK MARKETS TODAY

## WERE MIXED AT MARKET OPENING

Price Movement in Wall St.—Moderately Active in Montreal.

New York, Nov. 13.—Mixed price movements took place at the opening of today's stock market. Further profit taking and bear selling of some of the recently strong shares imparted a reactionary tone to the general industrial list. Famous Players dropped 13-16 points and United States Steel and Studebaker yielded fractionally.

### News Report

New York, Nov. 13.—Pursuing their recent tactics of stalling a buying demonstration in special shares to minimize the effect of selling elsewhere, bull operators took hold of the New Haven Railroad and the shipping shares today, pushing them up 1 to 2 points.

### Montreal Market

Montreal, Nov. 13.—Trading was moderately active and prices easier at the opening of today's stock market. Brazilian accounted for about 5-8 of the sales put through during the first half hour. This issue came out with a gain of one point to 36 7/8. Other price changes included Beco up 1-4 to 41-4; Abitibi off 1-4 to 38-4; Laurentide off 1-8 to 10; Breweries of 1-8 to 64 and Lawrence Flour off 1-8 to 64-4.
