WONDER STORY OF THE HEAVENS

Dr. J. S. Plaskett Announces
Finding of Extraordinary
Double Star—Ten Thousand
Years for its Light to
Reach the Earth.

Victoria, B. C., May 23.—Of special interest to astronomers is a discovery reported from the Dominion Astrophysical Observatory, Victoria, B. C. Dr. J. S. Plaskett, director of the observatory, announces that he recently found and is investigating an extraordinary double star, appearing to be about one hundred and forty times as massive as the sun and nearly five times as massive as any hitherto observed. It consists of two very large and very bright stars revolving around one another in a period of fourteen days at a separation from each other of about two-thirds the distance of the earth from the sun. The largest and brightest star is seventy-six and the other sixty-three times as massive as the sun.

The temperature of the two enormous stars is exceedingly high, about thirty thousand degrees Fahrenheit, and they are probably the brightest as well as the heaviest pair of stars in the sky. Although just visible on a good, clear night to the unaided eye as a star of the sixth magnitude, they are probably so far away that it takes their light more than 10,000 years to travel to the earth.

RADIO DIRECTS LAKE SHIPS.

The Compass Station Is Opened on Superior and Three Others Are Being Built.

Great Lakes Naval Training Station, Great Lakes, Ill., May 23.—For the first time navigation on Lake Superior has been radioed by wireless. On May 14 the first naval radio compass station on the lakes opened at White Fish Point to direct passing ships by wireless. At any hour the captain of a ship lost in the fog banks can call the radio station and ask his position. The reply will give the ship's direction from White Fish Point for the vessel's navigator to plot on his chart.

Within three weeks two more radio compass stations will open, one at Grand Marais, sixty miles west of White Fish Bay, and the other at Detour, at the mouth of St. Mary's River. When they are in operation the passing ships will receive their location from two of the stations and plotting those two lines on the chart the skipper will know his ship is at the point where the lines meet. The graveyards of the lakes stretch from White Fish Point to Grand Marais, the nearest point of refuge to the west. The sixty miles of desolate water, framed by sand dunes and lonely forests, has claimed an annual toll in ships and lives and cargo since navigation opened on the upper lakes. One vessel, a Canadian lighthouse tender, went down off White Fish Point in a storm a few weeks ago with ninety men.

SAVED FROM DROWNING.

Fisherman, Aged 71, Rescued by Nephew on Lake Hopatcong.

Lake Hopatcong, N. J., May 23.—Edward T. Taylor, seventy-one years old, of Dover, had a narrow escape from drowning while fishing in Lake Hopatcong with his nephew, Dr. William E. Taylor.

When in the middle of the lake the boat began to leak and soon was filled. The aged man slipped overboard. Dr. Taylor reached his side and forced him to the launch and had him hold on to the edge. Three times the aged man lost hold of the boat and sank. The physician succeeded in grabbing him the last time and then started to swim with him on his back. About a quarter of a mile from shore persons on shore put out in a launch and brought the two exhausted men to the shore.

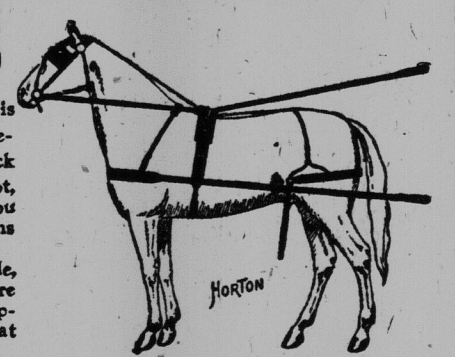

LAURENTIAN BUSY DOWN THE BAY

The C. G. S. Laurentian, Capt. McLean, has left St. John via Digby, with coal and other supplies for the Lanchester lightship. While at Digby the Laurentian replaced spar buoys at that port, also in the Annapolis Basin and Bear River, with the usual can and conical buoys, used during the summer season. After leaving there the ship visited Northwest Ledge buoy, Briar Island, reported not burning and relighted it. The ship discovered the Southwest Ledge buoy, Briar Island, not burning, and on investigation found the gas retainers had to be renewed, and reported to the St. John officers of the marine and fisheries. The Laurentian appliances are not sufficiently heavy to handle work of that nature.

Supt. Kelley and Engineer Morrissey were in Yarmouth in connection with the replacing of the dolphins, carried away by the ice, and orders for the replacing of which have been given to James V. Purdy, of Plymouth.

Board of Trade Conference to Be Held in Halifax

Representatives of Two Cities
to Get Together to Consider
Important Problems of Mutual
Interest.

Arising out of a public meeting last month, which was attended by G. Fred Pearson, representing the Halifax board of trade, a co-operative conference will be held on May 30 and 31 in Halifax between committees from each board. The St. John delegation will consist of W. P. Burditt, president; G. E. Barbour, vice-president; L. W. Simms and M. E. Agar. The agenda for the conference contains many subjects of great importance to the maritime provinces and beneficial results are hoped to follow this get-together.

The subjects proposed by the St. John board are as follows: Revival of interest in maritime province trade, tourist promotion, establishment of research institute, increased development of maritime resources, distinctive maritime immigration, closer relationship between maritime M. P.'s, transportation matters, uniform action regarding the utilization of Canadian ports and furthering of maritime publicity.

The Halifax board has suggested the following subjects and they will be discussed: Survey of manufacturing conditions in the maritime provinces, timber resources and forestation, colonization, divisional management of the Canadian National Railways, restoration of 1914 arbitrates, preferential duties on goods entering Canadian ports only, transatlantic freight and mail service, including summer service for maritime provinces, warehousing facilities, revision of the tax exemptions, revival of the Dominion grant for exhibition and appointment of a deputy minister of finance with a bureau at some central place in the maritime provinces.

Members of the two committees are now engaged studying the questions to be taken up, so that no time will be lost when they are under discussion.

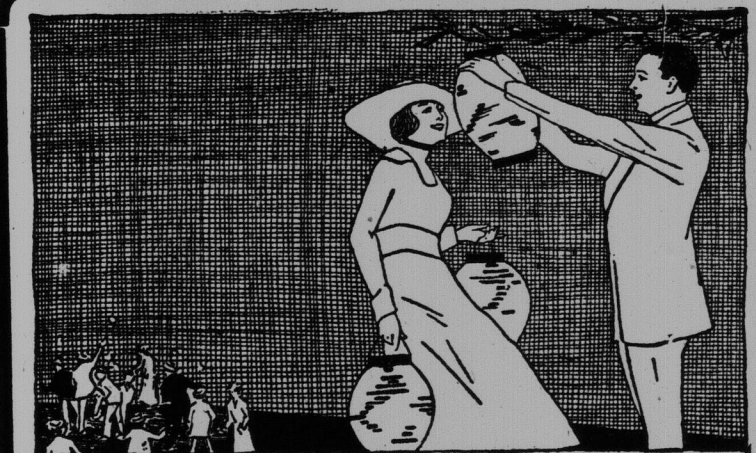
