MAKES NOTABLE BUILDING RECORD

Los Angeles Figures \$56,219,762 for First Eleven Months of This Year.

Los Angeles, Cal., Dec. 13.—Statistics covering the first eleven months of 1920 show that Los Angeles has expended \$56,219,762 on the construction of new

properties. These figures indicate a building boom such as the city has never before experienced and place it third in the United States in building figures for this period.

Of this sum, \$39,310,520 represents the building of dwellings alone. This figure, together with data compiled by hotel men who have reported to the Chamber of Commerce Tourist Housing Department that they are better equipped than last year to take care of patrons, is taken to prove the fallacy of predictions made early in the season by persons apprehensive of Los Angeles' ability comfortably to house her winter family.

The aid given strangers by the Chamber's Housing Bureau has done much to clear up threatened difficulties. This department of community service aims to list every reasonably priced house and apartment in the city, and, according to chamber officials, present listings show that this "clearing house" arrangement has averted the possibility of an acute shortage of living accommodations.

Figures show that 10,000 families have been taken care of by the building of new dwellings during 1920. The removal of these home owners to their own properties leaves many rental quarters vacant for the temporary sojourner and the tremendously increasing housing facilities gives assurance that Los Angeles is adequately prepared to house its annual influx of newcomers.

BRITAIN AND JAPAN

Baron Sakamoto Wants Alliance But With a Clause Removed.

Tokio, Nov. 12.—(Associated Press Correspondence).—Baron Sakamoto, a member of the House of Peers, advocates renewal of the Anglo-Japanese alliance and insists on the removal of the clause which exempts Great Britain from any obligations to Japan in the event of a dispute with America. Baron Sakamoto says that this exemption clause has been a dead letter for the last ten years.

The Baron argues that the clause is against the spirit of Article X of the league covenant, which places an equal obligation upon each member of the League of Nations in respect of mutual defence against territorial aggression.

Finally, he argues that the peace of the Pacific is now maintained by the balance of power of Great Britain, America and Japan. If Great Britain is relieved of her obligation by means of the arbitration treaty he asserts that the equilibrium of power in the Pacific will be destroyed.

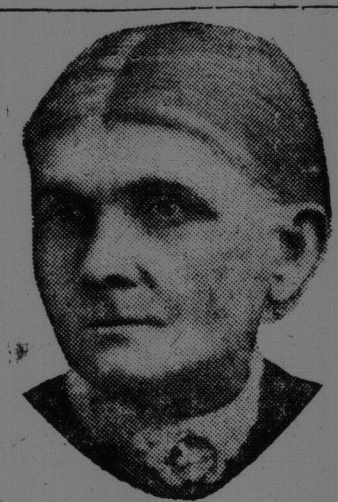
