## KAPLAN PLANS TO END PROTECTOR

Senator Explains Bill to Cor-  
rect Trade Abuses—Unfair  
Monopolists and Others  
Would Be Declared in  
Contempt of Court.

Albany, Feb. 12.—The creation of a  
Fair Trade Commission for the State  
of New York, with power to define  
and punish "unfair trade practices,"  
in order to correct the abuses of pro-  
tection, monopolization of dealers,  
destruction of so-called excess supplies  
to keep up prices, etc., is provided in  
a bill introduced by Senator Abraham  
Kaplan of Manhattan.

The bill is one of the most ambitious  
efforts to remedy merchandising con-  
ditions offered at this session of the  
legislature, and largely embodies ideas  
worked out during the operations of the  
Interstate Commerce act and the act  
creating the Federal Trade Commission.  
Senator Kaplan, admitting that it  
would be impossible to attempt to list  
all the so-called unfair trade practices  
prohibited by the provisions of the bill,  
has set forth in a statement to the  
Evening Post many of such practices to  
illustrate conditions that the bill is in-  
tended to correct. He outlined his  
measure as follows:

"The bill is one modeled after the  
Federal Fair Trade Commission Act. It  
creates a commission of three to be  
known as Fair Trade Commissioners to  
receive \$10,000 a year as compensation.  
The commission will have the power to  
compel the discontinuance of all unfair  
trade methods, trade practices, unfair  
restrictions of trade and unfair com-  
petition in State commerce.

"For some time past the people of the  
State of New York have been suffering  
from an acute situation that has had its  
origin in unfair trade practices. The State  
of New York has its Donnelly anti-trust  
law, which was created for the purpose  
of preventing monopolies and unfair  
trade practices, but has not had a tri-  
bunal with power to compel a dis-  
continuance of unfair trade practices. It  
is these unfair trade practices which  
have led to the existence of such situa-  
tions as rent profiteering and the high  
prices of foodstuffs, and other food com-  
modities and articles of general merchan-  
dise.

### Problem of Interstate Abuses.

"We have had a Federal Fair Trade  
Commission that has had jurisdiction  
over interstate commerce, but the great  
difficulty that we have been suffering  
from is abuses arising from interstate  
or internal commerce that has not come  
within the jurisdiction of the Inter-  
state Commerce Commission.

"Among the trade abuses which the  
Fair Trade Commission would have the

power to correct may be listed the fol-  
lowing:

petitor's supply or to destroy his mar-  
ket.
