HER DOGS HAVE REGAL FUNERAL

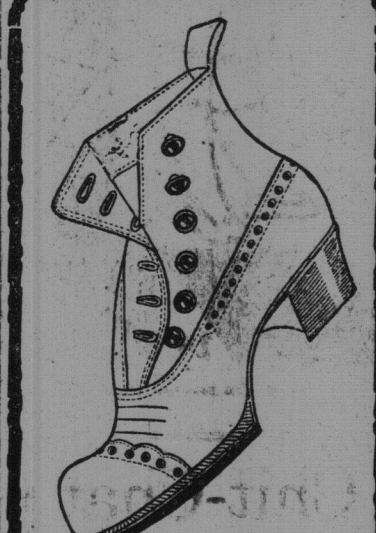


MISS JENNIE CROCKER
