NEW BRUNSWICK HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

THE following was adopted as one of the stand-
ing Rules of the House in the Session of
1862:
"26th. That no Bill of private nature shall
be received by the House until the fourteenth day
from the opening of the Session, both inclusive;
and that the Clerk or his Deputy, one month
previous to the meeting of the Legislature, cause
five copies of this Rule to be sent to each of the
Clerks of the Peace in the several Counties, for
distribution, and cause the same to be inserted in
the Royal Gazette, and two Newspapers, in such
County were Newspapers are published."
