KILLED KING AND QUEEN.

Servant Animated by Hostile Feelings for Years.

The Revolution Was Planned Many Weeks Ago - Plot Carefully Carried Out - Sensational Scenes at Vienna.

BELGRADE, Serbia, June 11 - King Alexander and Queen Draga were shot to death in the royal palace during the night. The deed was carried out by the army.

Vienna, June 11 - Despatches from Belgrade say that since the late King Alexander's last suspension of the Serbian constitution the army has been animated by hostile feelings toward both the King and Queen.

At a sitting to be held on June 12 the King is expected to give a personal and authoritative order to the army and the government will take steps to maintain it. The government will ensure for the new order of the King, who perceived his danger, fled with Queen Draga to the palace roof.

At about 2 o'clock this morning Queen Draga's two brothers were shot in the back of the head. The prince and his brother-in-law, M. Milkovitch, the minister of the interior, and his daughter, and his wife, minister, General Pavlovitch.

The startling news from Belgrade disturbed the solemn ceremonial of the annual Corpus Christi procession in a manner unprecedented in the history of Francis Joseph's long reign.
