WILL BUILD SIX STEAMERS.

New York World: The Hamburg American Steamship Company's plans to engage in the American coastwise trade have reached the stage of calling for estimates on American construction of six steamers. They are to be of approximately 10,000 tons burden and cost about \$2,000,000 each. At the Hamburg-American offices Thursday it was stated that the invitation to submit estimates was not an indication that the company intends to proceed without obtaining assurance as to the security of foreign investment in the coastwise business. When Bernard N. Baker of Baltimore failed to obtain American capital for his proposed coast-to-coast line, via the Panama Canal, the Hamburg-American line offered to furnish half the required capital, up to \$15,000,000, provided it could be assured that such investment would not be discriminated against later. CAPTAIN'S APPEAL ALLOWED. CAPTAIN'S APPEAL ALLOWED.

The appeal of Captain Hoy, formerly master of the Bengore Head, against the sentence of the Dominion Wreck Commission Court, which was held at Quebec on October 17, 1912, was heard in the Admiralty Court in London on May 23, and the appeal was allowed. The evidence showed that when the Bengore Head stranded in the vicinity of Shoal Cove, near Flower Island, in the Straits of Belle Isle, on October 5 last year, Captain Hoy had been on duty for 30 hours, in consequence of foggy, weather, and had actually been on the bridge for 20 hours.
