College Young Men's Christian Association.—A branch of this Society has been formed and is in a flourishing condition. At present there are about 90 members.

Acadia Missionary Society.—This Society holds monthly meetings. Its aim is to cultivate interest in Missionary work, and especially to gain information respecting Christian Missions in foreign lands.

PRAYER MEETINGS.

Prayer Meetings, conducted by the Students, are regularly held on Lord's Day morning and on Wednesday evening throughout the College year. These social services have been continuously maintained, it is believed, ever since the founding of the College.

REMARKS.

The officers of the College will seek in all proper ways to promote the moral and religious, as well as the intellectual, culture of the Students. All members of the College are expected to attend public worship regularly on the Sabbath. Parents and guardians are requested to give instructions as to the place of worship which they wish the Students under their care to attend. Religious services are held every Sabbath in the village in connection with the Baptists, Church of England, Methodists and Presbyterians.

All Students are expected to be present at Morning Prayers. Opportunity for uniting in Bible study on the Lord's Day will be provided.

Special rules will be announced by the Faculty, from time to time, as circumstances may require. Students will occupy such rooms and lodgings as are approved by the Faculty.

The use of spirituous or malt liquors by students is not permitted.

Inattention to study, or misbehaviour of any kind, will subject the offender to private or public reproof, a record of demerit in the weekly report, or suspension, at the discretion of the Faculty.
