CENTENNIAL SCHOLARSHIP The New Brunswick RCMP Centennial Scholarship Fund was established in 1983 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the RCMP. The fund is administered by a board of directors comprised of eight NCOs from detachments within New Brunswick and three representatives of the New Brunswick RCMP Veterans' Association.

The objective of the fund is to provide an annual scholarship to help either a child of an RCMP member or ex-member or of a veteran of the RCMP, to further his/her education. Funds for these scholarships are donated by RCMP members, NCOs' Messes, "J" Division Recreation Club, the RCMP Veteran's Association, RCMP Benefit Trust Fund and various functions.

Each year, the interest generated by the fund is granted in bursaries and to date, seventeen bursaries have been authorized. This year, we were able to present three \$200 bursaries. The three recipients chosen from a selection of 27 applicants were: Lesley Burris, Deborah Wadden and Christopher Gatto.
