POULTRY SHOW PRIZE LIST—LECTURE GIVEN LAST NIGHT

Brant County Men Are Congratulated on the Class of Their Exhibits—Show is Far Ahead of Any Previous Effort—The Prize Winners.

There was a n excellent crowd at the Poultry Show last evening and great interest was taken in the exhibits.

During the evening Mr. F. N. Marcellus of the Department for Poultry Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, lectured on Feeding and Preparing Birds for Market. Mr. Marcellus is an able speaker and certainly knows his subject well.

He spoke highly of the local show stating that the quality this year is far higher than last. Five years ago poultry work was not receiving near as much attention as at present, and eggs and stock are in greater demand than ever before.

There is a great difference in results secured by different methods of feeding. Good results are not secured by feeding birds of a nervous, lighter nature, the same food as for birds of heavier class.

Instructions were given on rearing fowl. An increase in the weight of birds is secured if fed on mashed foods and more fat is added to the muscle fibres and 25 p.c. more is secured for them than for range fed birds. Two parts buttermilk or sour milk to one part of meal is a good food to get results. The results of forced feeding has not proven economical enough to be practical in Canada. The yellow color of skin of a bird is intensified by ground corn and linseed meal, while the color will be decreased by buckwheat.

For killing birds for home use, dislocating the neck is the easiest method, but birds should be bled if intended for the market. Before killing it is best to give the birds no food for 24 hours before death, so as to eliminate all food from the intestinal tract.

No amount of feeding will put fat on the breast of a bird; careful breeding is the only way. In 99 cases out of 100 a bird on which the skin of the shanks is tender will be a tender bird for table use.

The speaker then said he was willing to answer any questions relating to fowl. He was kept busy for some time answering queries, and was also able to give the desired information. His talk was very greatly appreciated, and will no doubt prove of great value to all who were present.
