Certificate. Has a very high reputation as a marksman, having been a member of the Canadian Wimbledon Teams in 1874, '75 and '79, winning prizes on all these occasions. In 1879 he won the Prince of Wales' prize (a badge and £100). In 1881, commanded the Canadian Wimbledon Team which defeated the British Team in the Rifle contest for the Rajah of Kolopore's cup. Was also a member of the Canadian team at Creedmoor, in 1876 and 1880. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1879 and reelected at last g.e. A Liberal.—Hamilton; Hamilton Club; National Club, Toronto.

GIBSON, THOMAS. (East Huron.)

S. of Mr. Thomas Gibson. B. at Greenlaw, Berwickshire, Scot., 8 Jan. 1825. Ed. there. M., 1st, 1854, Miss Elizabeth Hudson, (she d.); 2nd, Sarah, eld. dau. of Richard Young, Esq., of Lakelet. Was Reeve of Howick for seven years. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1867. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1871; re-elected at g.e. 1875, '79, and at last g.e. A Liberal,—Wroxeter, Ont.

GILLIES, JOHN. (North Bruce.)

Third s. of Hugh Gillies, a native of Glasgow, Scot. B. in Kilcalmonell, Scot., and ed. there. Came to Can. in 1852. Is a farmer and a Major in the militia. Has been Reeve of the Tp. of Elderslie for several years, and Warden of the Co. of Bruce for five years. Sat for North Bruce in the Commons from g.e. 1872 to g.e. 1882, when he was an unsuccessful candidate. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal—Paisley, Ont.

GOULD, ISAAC JAMES. (North Ontario.)

Descended from a Quaker family, formerly resident in Pennsylvania. Father, the late Joseph Gould, represented North Ontario in the Parlt of the Prov. of Can. for seven years. B. at Uxbridge. 13 Nov. 1839, and ed. there. M., 23 Sept. 1862, Rebecca, dau. of Ira and Nancy Chapman, Uxbridge. Is a farmer, lumberman and owner of grist and woollen mills. Has been a mem. of the Uxbridge Council and Reeve for several years; Warden of the Co. of Ontario in 1883; a dir. and Presdt. of the N. Ontario Agricultural Soc. and a dir. and Presdt of the Uxbridge Mechanics' Institute First, returned to Leg. Assem, at last g.e. A Liberal.—Uxbridge.
