DUCHESNAY, *Lieut. Col. Hon.* ELZÉAR HENRI JUSCHEREAU.

A descendant of a family of some note. S. of the late Hon. Antoine Louis Juschereau Duchesnay, Executive and Legislative Councillor of L. C., by Louise Fleury de Lagorgendiere. The name was originally Juschereau de St. Denis: a branch of the family still flourishes in France, two individuals of which have attained high rank in the military service, one of whom, present in Russia during the campaign of 1812-13, has written an interesting work. On the acquisition of the *Fief Duchesnay*, about 150 years ago, the Canadian branch, according to the French custom, took the name of the property. By his mother, Mr. D. is descended from the Lemoines, created Barons de Longueuil. M., 1st, 1834, Miss Perrault, dau. of the late Hon. Mr. Justice Perrault, of Quebec, (she d.) 2ndly, Eliza Suzanne, 2nd dau. of the late Hon. Mr. Justice T. T. Taschereau. Is Lieut. Col.
