REMARKS.

a. Mr. Lash received, in addition, as Solicitor for the Indian Office, \$400; preparing rules and tariff of the Maritime Court of Ontario, \$400; and as Counsel for the Crown before the Supreme Court *in re* Intercolonial Railway, \$350.

b. Mr. Kinloch transferred to Department of Interior from 1st November, 1878.

Mr. J. Griffin to take the above vacancy from 18th November, 1878. O.C., 18th November, 1878.

H. B. S. Lane to take vacancy by retirement of M. J. Griffin, from 1st March, 1879, at \$700 per annum. O.C., 25th April, 1879.

(Mr. Griffin retired 31st January, 1879.)

One made a Chief Clerk, at \$1,550; two increased to \$1,400, and one to \$1,200.—Messrs. Griffin and Lane taking the place of the fifth. O.C., 13th June, 1879.

c. Mr. Fraser appointed to succeed Mr. Steele (who retired 30th April, 1879), at \$300 per annum.

d. Mr. Kinloch, Secretary from 1st July to 31st October; Mr. Griffin, from this date to 31st January, 1879, and Mr. Hall to the end of June.

Mr. Power acted as French Secretary from 1st July to 31st October, 1878.

e. Over estimated.

f. The estimate was for a whole year's salary, but Mr. Walkem, of British Columbia, was only paid for the last six months.
