The Minister **Holdsty** observes that there is no doubt that an addition to the present Reserve at Fisher's Grant, which contains only eighty acres is very desirable, therebeing about thirty-eight families in the Band and the extent of the reserved land owned by them arounts to 80 acres above mentioned and orether small deserve of 50 acres situated on the Str it, of Northemseriend, or one hundred and thirty dered alterether for the thirty-eight families. The want of wood moretver on the Reserve at Fisher's Grant removes it desirable to acquire this piece of land interact that the function may to able to obtain fuel, fending and purchas.

The finite further observes that the obstacle in the way of recommending this purchase at the time the opplication was made and recommended by the Agent consisted in the fact that the Department had then no time if a deposal wherewith to complete the purchase. There is now at the creait of the Nova Scotia Indians' trust fund between \$ 400.00, and \$ 500.00, and the interest which accrues upon this amount would be so indialificant as to be useless for similar differentiation of the Indian et the Decension.
