I have your letter of the 28th instant in further reference to the disposal of the burnt and fallen timber on the Gibson Reserve.


The Department accepted the highest tender which was submitted by Mr. Archie McGibbon, Penetanguishene, and was as follows:- for Hemlock \$6.51 per M. ft. B. M., for Hardwood \$6.51 per M. ft. B.M., and for rough and undersized wood \$1.00 per cord.

This timber is situated on lots 1 to 5 inclusive, concessions 1 to 5 inclusive, on the southeastern portion of the Reserve.

I am enclosing herewith a blueprint indicating the location.
