The aircraft flipped over on its back.</p> <p>Major Underhill, Commanding Officer of Brookes Field, San Antonio, and Major Lindsay, also of the United States Air Service, up on an inspection trip and spending a few days as guests of Rockcliffe Air Station, paid us a visit.
