Had space been available, I have no doubt it would be under one roof.

The Department of Overseas Trade has a subsidiary office in the City - in same building as the Canadian Trade Commissioner - where enquiries may be dealt with by appointment; for distribution of literature, and dealing with general enquiries.

I suggest that there is no difficulty likely to arise if the administration of the Trade Commissioner's Office is conducted from a central building. Concentration of effort will follow; confusion of offices disappear, and economies can be effected in staff and overhead expense. The Trade Commissioner becomes an advisor to, and executive official of, the High Commissioner on all trade matters affecting the Dominion.
