Dear Mr Maclean,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant, regarding the case of the Indian Thomas Bartlett, who is being cared for by the Overseers of the Poor District No 9, Bridgewater, Lunenburg County; and in reply I beg to say that the Department will pay the Overseers for the period referred to for care of Bartlett at the same rate as charged in the account to which you have referred, and which the Department has already agreed to settle. Both accounts will be dealt with when a new appropriation for relief is voted by Parliament and becomes available.

The Department, I may say, is writing Agent Harlow in this matter.
