Her husband apparently left her some few years ago, and she has not received any Treaty money for herself and children for 4 years. It appears that her husband draws the Annuity every year.

I would be pleased if you would inform me if the Annuity for Joe Wynne has been paid out this year. If not, possibly his wife's cheque could be sent in care of this office for 1 woman, 1 boy, and 1 girl.

I may say that the girl is an epileptic case, and the woman applied to this office for relief. I am sending under separate cover a letter asking for relief supplies for this woman.
