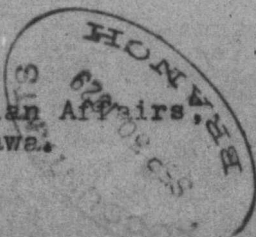
I beg to acknowledge receipt of letter No. 3-104, dated 19th inst. relative to a treaty payment made to Mrs. Emil Medicine Traveller, No. K83, of the Low Horn Band, Blackfoot Agency. In reply I wish to state that this woman originally belonged to this band. She has been living here since 1926, and is living with a Montana half breed, one Phillip Many Hides, and at the time of treaty, correspondence passed between Mr. Gooderham and myself and under date of July 2nd Mr. Gooderham wrote to me advising that I might as well pay this woman her treaty here. This I did. At the time, however, I asked the Chief and Headmen whether or not they would take this woman back into the band. They advised me that they were willing to take her back into the band. I should have advised the Department to this effect, and I may say that I paid this woman under Band No. V104, and after closing my books Mr. Gooderham remitted me her treaty money, which I returned. I think it advisable that she be transferred back to her own band.
