Reverend Sir,-

The Department is in receipt of a communication from Mr. Commissioner Graham, enclosing a copy of a letter which you received from T. Eastwood Jackson, of Fir Ridge, Sask., in which he requests that the son of a halfbreed who was killed at Vimy Ridge, be placed in the Brandon Industrial School.


The Department, in view of the circumstances, will make an exception in the case of this boy and, provided he is a protestant, will consent to his admission to your school. You may take the necessary steps to have him placed in your school. An application and certificate of health for his admission should be forwarded. The application should be signed by the guardian or some person responsible for him.

The admission of this boy is not to form a precedent, as it is considered that in his case he does not comply with the Department's ruling regarding the admission of halfbreed children to residential schools.
