

Among many other achievements of the Liberal Government of more or less direct value to labour, are the following:

The Fair Wages Policy, adopted in 1900, was made more effective by orders in Council passed in 1907, 1922 and 1924. The fair wages policy of the Dominion Government for the protection of workers engaged in the execution of federal contracts has been copied in most of the provinces and by many municipal authorities and other public bodies in Canada.

The protection of union labels, long desired by organized labour, was secured by a measure enacted in 1927.

A Standing Committee of the House of Commons to consider Industrial and International Relations was appointed, 1924, on the motion of the Prime Minister.

The Technical Education Act, although enacted in 1919 under the Conservative regime, bases its provisions on the recommendations made by the Royal Commission on Technical Education appointed by the Government of Sir Wilfrid Laurier in 1910.
