FINANCE REPORT, TORONTO SECTION, 1881-82.

The Committee on Finance of the Western Section are glad to report an increase in all the funds during the past year. The increase is all the larger in consequence of several legacies and donations, especially the large bequests to several of the schemes of the late Mr. Joseph McKay, of

Montreal.

As the funds of the missionary, educational, and benevolent schemes are brought under the review of the Assembly in the Reports of the several Committees, it is considered necessary in this Report to advert only to the Assembly Fund.

The total receipts were \$4,098,99, of which amount the sum of \$650 was from the Hynni Book Committee. The expenditure was \$4,262.27, leaving a balance on the year of \$163.28.

In several of the Presbyteries the amount has been collected by the Presbytery itself, and remitted by the Pre-oytery Clerk or Treasurer. The Presbyteries of Lamenburg and Yarmouth, Barrie, Guelph and Saugeen may be mentioned as Presbyteries that have attended to this matter, It will be borne in mind that the Assembly has more than once directed Presbyteries to collect the sunount from their congregations, and were all to comply with the direction it is believed that the amount required for Assembly purposes would be easily raised. In some Presbyteries to resbyteries there are congregations that have not contributed to the Assembly Fund since the period of mion. It is recommended that the Assembly renew their instructions to Presbyteries in regard to this matter.

The accounts, which are subjoined, have been examined and certified by the Hon. John McMurrich and William Alexander, Esq.
